the history

In 1996 "la fraternidad" was founded by Rosa Estela Ochoa Palma, a former mother of the SOS-Children's Villages who took care of children threatened by violence, poverty, neglect and abuse. In the beginning she worked in her own house, later a small office was provided for free by the city of Condega.

The crucial factor for the work of the centre is the inclusion of parents since violence, children and adolescents are exposed to, often derives from the children's homes.

We have been supporting the centre since 1997 by financing the salaries for 9 employees (about € 75 net a month). That makes a total amount of € 10.000 gross a year including all social security contributions, which can be provided with the support of friends, the BRG XXII (grammar school in the 22. district of Vienna), the Entwicklungs-hilfeklub (development club) and the Austrian Development Agency (ADA) of the Republic of Austria.
